All other grassed areas will be managed to support our local nature and biodiversity in Muscliff, which means the grass in these areas will not be regularly cut.

- New trees - planted 2022-25
- New native hedgerow/shrubs - planted 2022-25
- New whip planting for biodiversity - planted 2024-25
