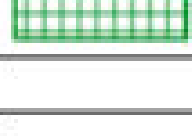
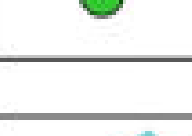
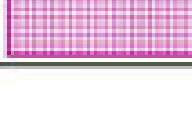

-  Long grass meadow areas - annual cut & collect only, late summer-autumn
-  Areas to remain uncut - below trees and areas of bulbs
-  Paddling pool area - regular grass cut during growing season, by hand
-  Existing woodland, understorey kept clear for visibility
-  Existing woodland, managed for biodiversity, creation of glades
-  New trees - planted 2024
-  Ornamental shrubs, annual cut
-  1m margin to tennis courts kept clear of vegetation
-  Areas managed by The Parks Foundation and volunteers
