- Existing trees
- Areas not managed by BCP Council
- Mown grass
- Long grass meadow areas - annual cut & collect only late summer-autumn
- Mown path margins
- 1m margin to tennis courts kept clear of vegetation
- Areas managed by volunteers
- New trees - planted 2022-23
- Native hedgerows - hand pruning by The Parks Foundation with volunteers
- Holly hedge - cut once per year, remove bramble/weed growth
- Timber picnic benches, mown grass surround
- Perimeter park vegetation, 2 yearly pruning, keep paths clear
- Banks cut every 2 years to avoid woody growth
- Sustainable drainage (SuDS) area
